CHAPTER 130: OFFENSES AGAINST MUNICIPAL REGULATIONS

§ 130.01 DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION OF CITY PROPERTY.

- (A) No person or persons shall mutilate, damage or destroy any real or personal property belong to the city.
- (B) The Mayor and City Clerk are authorized and directed to offer and post a reward of \$25 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons for mutilating, damaging or destroying any property belonging to the city.

§ 130.02 CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS IN HOUSING AUTHORITY PROPERTY.

- (A) No person shall carry a concealed weapon into or upon the non-private residential areas of the Housing Authority of Benton property.
- (B) (1) PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL AREAS. Rooms of apartments used as single family residences.
- (2) NON-PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL AREAS. The grounds, administrative offices, community rooms, maintenance areas, laundry rooms, police substations, day-care centers, educational facilities, playgrounds, parking areas, and streets located upon the Housing Authority of Benton property. This area encompasses all Housing Authority of Benton property other than private residential areas as defined above.
- (C) No person shall carry a concealed deadly weapon into or upon the buildings or property areas of the city.

- (D) BUILDINGS OR PROPERTY AREAS. The city hall buildings, police department, street department maintenance garage, water treatment plant, sewer treatment plant, fire department, city parks, and parking areas.
- (E) Persons violating this section may be denied entrance to the premises, ordered to leave the premises, and if employees of the Housing Authority of Benton or the city violate this section they shall be subject to employee disciplinary measures including but not limited to suspension or termination of employment.
- (F) The areas in which the carrying of concealed deadly weapons is prohibited shall be identified by signs posted at the entrance to the restricted areas. (Ord. 96-10-01, passed 10-21-96)

§ 130.99 PENALTY.

- (A) Any person who violates any provision of this chapter for which no penalty is otherwise provided shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined up to \$500, imprisoned up to 30 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- (B) Any person who violates any provision of § 130.02 shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined up to \$250.
